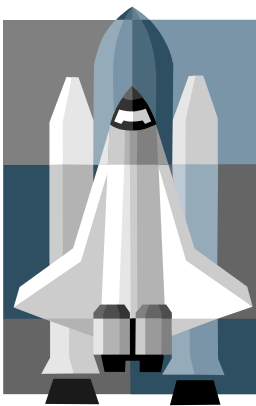


2010 Aviation Camp
